Pastor Scott's Perspective — "Let's Do It Again"

From a personal perspective, nothing can compare with the birth of our first grandchild and news of three more on the way as highlights for 2009 (along with our 35th wedding anniversary).

From a ministry perspective, one of the highlights for me (in addition to the vision process, a mission trip to Moldova, and some awesome IPT prayer sessions) was preaching through the Bible.

2009 was the first time that I preached through the Bible using The One Year Bible. Instead of being organized according to books of the Bible, this Bible is arranged according to 365 daily readings. Each day of the year includes an OT reading, a NT reading, a Psalm and a couple of verses from Proverbs. January begins with Genesis and Matthew, and the beginning of Psalms and Proverbs. We are just now finishing up Zechariah and Malachi in the OT, and Revelation in the NT. Each Psalm is covered twice in a year.

Many of you have been reading The One Year Bible with me this past year. It takes about 15-20 minutes to do each day's readings. I like the variety of reading from the OT, NT, Psalms and Proverbs each day. Almost every day you'll find something that God can use to speak to you.

Each week in 2009 I have selected a sermon text from that week's readings. I didn't cover every book of the Bible, but you heard sermons from more books of the Bible in one year than you normally would. And I preached some texts that I have never preached before in 30+ years of preaching. In 2009 I ended up preaching 20 times from the Old Testament (11 different books) and 33 times from the New Testament (18 different books). (Some weeks had two texts).

This discipline was valuable and enriching for me. Some weeks I was forced to deal with challenging texts that I would not normally choose to preach. Some weeks I preached some wonderful texts that somehow I had never or rarely preached in the past.

It is easy for pastors to preach certain topics and texts that are most familiar or comfortable or popular. Certain topics and texts and doctrines and books of the Bible are

preached frequently. Others are neglected — preached rarely or never at all. Church members do not experience a balanced spiritual diet.

It is also tempting for pastors to preach what people want to hear. The result is messages and series that are relevant, practical, interesting — but sometimes biblically shallow and unbalanced with respect to the whole of Scriptural teaching. I wonder if that is one reason why so many evangelicals today are lacking in spiritual depth and biblical knowledge and are confused on many issues such as salvation through Christ alone in spite of a growing number of mega-churches attracting big crowds.

Of course, there are pros and cons with any method of preaching — whether topical series or expositions of books of the Bible or lectionary or this one year Bible series. Every method has its drawbacks. No one method is right for every pastor or every church or every year.

But this past year has been such an enriching experience for me personally — and I believe a growing experience for many of you — that I plan to preach through The One Year Bible again in 2010. Of course, I will mostly choose different texts this year. Most weeks this

past year there were two or three or four excellent preaching texts in a week's readings, and it was sometimes hard to choose only one. I anticipate again this year preaching many excellent texts that I have rarely or never preached before.

There is nothing particularly glamorous about this kind of preaching schedule. It is not a classic method for building worship attendance growth. Yet, interestingly, our worship attendance did increase in 2009 (for a variety of reasons). I believe many of you also experienced spiritual growth – especially if you were reading through the Bible daily with this reading plan. I encourage you to do the same in 2010. *It would be great if a majority of our members and attenders would read through The One Year Bible together in 2010.*

If there is sufficient interest, we might even want to set up a blog through our church website where people could interact with me and each other concerning the daily readings and weekly sermons. *(This is beyond my technological expertise to set up, but we have other capable tech people in our church who could do that.)* Let me know if you would be interested in such a blog. This might be a way for God to “enlarge our Kingdom territory.”

Of course, there will be times in the coming year when it would be important for me to address a certain theme or topic in keeping with the vision statement or a holiday or some timely need in the life of our church. I may occasionally depart from the weekly readings. But it was interesting how often God matched the weekly texts with His activity in the

Financial Report

December was a good giving month. Giving to the General Fund (church budget) averaged \$10,333 per week for the four Sundays. This is slightly above weekly budget (\$9,579), but we are still below budget for the fiscal year. Worship Attendance has also been good, averaging 326 per Sunday.

Giving to the Building Fund totaled \$13,171 in December. We are on target to pay off our ROCK mortgage by late summer or early fall of next year.

A Word From Pastor Mark

As we move into 2010, I would like to thank my Cornerstone family for being a joy to serve and work alongside. You are such a blessing to me and my family. Thanks for the encouraging years together.

The closer we get to Christ's return the more difficult it will become. The world will not become less seductive and evil will not become nicer. On the contrary, the world is notching up its seductiveness and evil is increasing.

Revelation 21 reveals a future for us to focus on to not fall prey to the allure of the world or cave in to pressure to give up Jesus. God is working on four mind boggling transformations according to Rev. 21.

The first transformation is: A new Heaven and Earth. (v. 1). Verse 1 "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea." It is hard to imagine the need for God to create a new earth. Our world is so beautiful. But the world isn't as it should be. When sin crept in it affected the earth. Prior to sin there were no earthquakes, no tornados, no famine, and no droughts. And if you have been reading the book of Revelation, you see that the earth is going to be trashed when God unleashes His wrath upon evil. The earth will be devastated.

A couple more facts about the new heaven and earth: There will no longer be a heaven and an earth. Heaven will become earth because God will live there.

There will be "No more sea". From first reading, those of us who love the ocean and big bodies of water might feel discouraged. Some of my best worship times have been near the sea. But no more sea does not mean "no more water." The sea was thought of to the NT readers as dangerous, and sometimes evil. Many were drowned in the sea, and in Rev 13, the beast comes out of the sea. And for us, the sea means separation from people we care about. Three fourths of our globe consists of water, but this won't be the case in the eternal state. There will be bodies of water, but the way earth will be configured will keep it from separating God's people.

Little else is revealed to us regarding the new earth. However, we must assume that the best that we have ever seen and experienced on this earth will pale in comparison to life on the new earth.

The second transformation is: A New Jerusalem. (vv. 2, 9-27). Verse 2, "I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband." In our culture the thought of a New Jerusalem doesn't produce much joy and hope. In the United States no city stands out like Jerusalem did to the readers in NT times. Jerusalem is the city that God said, "But now I have chosen Jerusalem for my Name to be there, and I have chosen David to rule my people Israel."

The New Jerusalem is nothing like we have ever seen before. The New Jerusalem has a great wall with twelve gates with twelve angels at the gates. The twelve tribes of Israel are written on the gates. Three gates to the north, three east, three south and three on west side of the city. Each gate is made of a single pearl. The main street is made of pure gold. The city wall has twelve foundations made out of twelve precious stones. The names of the twelve apostles are etched on the foundations. The city doesn't need the sun or moon because God's glory lights the city.

The New Jerusalem is shaped like a cube and is 1,380 miles wide. You could travel the distance from the NW tip of South Dakota to Miami, Florida and still be within the walls of the New Jerusalem! What is even more amazing is that it is 1,380 miles high as well. Mt Everest is less than 6 miles high; this city is more than 250 times as high as Mt Everest. The height of the orbit of the Hubble telescope is 360 miles above the earth. The New Jerusalem is almost four times as high.

The third transformation is: A new Temple (vv. 3, 22). Verse 3, "And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God." And verse 22, "I did not see a temple in the city, because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple."

The temple will be no more. God will not reside in the Temple's Holy of Holies where only a select few could enter. God will be with us. We can talk and hug Jesus. We can walk with Jesus. We can sit at His feet and listen to stories. We can worship Jesus while seeing with our own eyes His nail pierced hands and feet.

The fourth transformation is: A new Victory (v. 4). Verse 4, "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." We have all tasted pain and heartache and sorrow because death still exists. Death has taken our parents, our grandparents, our spouses, our children, our friends, our acquaintances.

Heartaches and sadness are temporary. One day, God is going to wipe it all away. No more death. No more broken hearts. No more sadness. No more mourning. No more severed relationships. Everything brand new. These four transformations will take place after the thousand year reign of Jesus on the earth during the Millennium, followed by a short time that Satan will be set free to try to deceive the nations. Then all who ever lived will stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ to have their lives reviewed. All evil will finally be done away with forever. Then the four transitions will come to fruition and they will last forever.

Praise God for what He is doing! Allow these truths to stir up courage and motivation to overcome the world and evil.

Parking

We are facing a good problem: *worship attendance growth means that it is hard to find a parking space some Sunday mornings.* We have had some 325+ attendance Sundays when every space in our church lots is full, and the Mel Foster lot is also full or nearly full. Continued worship attendance growth will be stifled if people cannot find a parking spot at 10:10. Not many visitors will think (or want) to park at Hardees (though we may ask some church leaders to park there with permission). The Trustees are working on some plans to expand our parking capacity.

Some reminders: *church leaders, worship team, active members in good health, please park away from the sanctuary entrance spots.* Leave the spaces closest to the sanctuary for visitors, older members, mothers with babies, etc. *As many leaders as possible should park in the Mel Foster lot to make room in our church lots for others.*

Thank you for your cooperation – and thanks also to our parking hosts for their service.

What do you do with extra money?

The church recently received \$5000 for the lease on the property being used for the shared access with the development to the west of us.

What do you do when you receive extra money such as a gift or bonus or inheritance or tax refund?

Our Trustees have set a good example by deciding to tithe on the \$5000. \$500 will be given to missions, and the remainder (after any legal fees incurred) will be applied to the ROCK mortgage (which will soon be down to \$50,000 – and likely will be paid off some time this spring or early summer).

We encourage you to do likewise when you receive some extra money – give at least a tithe. Give to the church or to missions or to the poor. God doesn't give us extra money just so we can spend it all on ourselves. We are to be channels of blessing, not reservoirs.

Fasting & Praying for the Vision

As the Vision Team senses they are near the end of the vision process, they ask that everyone would consider setting aside a day (or at least an hour) to pray and fast for the team and the clarification of the final details.

The prayer room will be open anytime the church is open and we encourage you to use it individually or in groups.
